Report on CSL 2025

- 37 PC members, 8 women
- CSL has 70 participants, including the invited speakers and 16 local participants
- 23 CSL participants registered only for the workshops
- There were 115 submitted papers, with double blind review
- 351 reviews (137 by external subreviewers)
- 43 accepted papers (acceptance rate of 37%)
- Proceedings published as in Leibniz International Proceedings in Informatics - 34th EACSL Annual Conference on Computer Science Logic (CSL 2026).

General business

- EACSL scientifically sponsored WoLLiC, LMW, ESSLLI in 2025.
- EACSL is represented in LMCS board, SIGLOG committee for ACM Research Highlights, TheoretiCS Editorial Board in 2025.

General questions

- A question was asked by Barbara König, concerning the necessity of nominating a workshop chair for future CSL conferences. Maribel Fernandez answered that it's usually the organizers who decide between nominating a workshop chair or making an open call for workshops.
- Stefano Guerrini pointed out that the choice of having reviews be double-blind poses difficulties in ensuring that subreviewers are not in conflict with the authors. Barbara König suggested that perhaps using other tools than EasyChair could help.
- Giulio Guerrieri shared that for CSL 2026 he had 10 papers to review, which is a lot, especially since it's harder and harder to find subreviewers. From this, followed an animated discussion on reviews and potential solutions. There was no clear conclusion.
- Jurriaan Rot asked about the ranking of CSL. Maribel Fernandez answered that CSL is currently ranked B. To achieve a rank of A, they would have to select PC members and invited speakers based on metrics such as the h-index. She made clear that the position of EACSL is not to base its selection criterion on such metrics.
