7. Report on the Ackermann Award 2018

- Chairman's report. 11 excellent nominations for the Ackermann Award were received in 2018. All the nominations were excellent.
- The winner is Amina Doumane.
- The next Ackermann Award will be given in January 2020.

8. Report on CSL 2018

Presented by Dan Ghica (co-chair of CSL 2018). Summary: there were 100 abstracts submitted, 86 full submissions, 36 papers accepted, and the acceptance ratio was 40%. There were 85 participants. There were separate scores for technical merits and personal interest: all papers with technical mistakes were rejected and the remaining papers were scored based on the interest.

9. Future CSL Conferences (no. 2019, 2020-2022)

Shifting the CSL slot from August/September to January

- Problem: CSL has been recognized of being too close to LICS, time-of-the-year-wise.
- Solution: we move from August/September to January (right after CSL 2018, in particular there will be no CSL 2019).
- Proposal: The membership endorses the decision that the next CSL will take place in January 2020. In particular, it is decided that the next membership meeting will be in January 2020, at CSL 2020. The submission deadline should be in July.
- Discussion on the proposal.
- The proposal is accepted unanimousily.
